The Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees of The Gray Charter School recognizes the requests of the Parent Academy and parents of the children of The Gray Charter School to adopt a mandatory school uniform policy.

The Board of Trustees agrees with the parents that a mandatory uniform policy is beneficial to the learning process and fosters a positive learning environment without distractions. The uniform has been selected by the parent academy, Principal, staff and Board of Trustees shared with the parents at three parent meetings.

The Board of Trustees recognizes the inability of some parents due to economic hardships the ability to purchase the uniform. Therefore, the school will offer to those who provide adequate proof of economic hardship, uniforms at no cost to the family. The Board also maintains that economic hardship does not constitute the right of their children not to be in uniform.

The Board of Trustees require full compliance with the school uniform policy and offers no alternatives to the policy and all students admitted to the school must comply with this policy.

The Board of Trustee further directs the Executive Director to establish procedures for appropriate dress of its students, such as any extreme hair style, excessive jewelry including no earrings on males.

As a safety precaution students will **not** be allowed to participate in our physical education program while wearing jewelry. Jewelry shall include, but not limited to: watches, earrings, nose rings, jewelry studs, bracelets, necklaces, pins, any type of facial piercing or other visible body piercing. This will reduce the risk of students from being severely injured by falling or making contact with another student.

It is the Boards desire to provide a safe environment for our students who participate in our physical education programs.

As a safety precaution students will be required to wear non-marking sneakers in our inside physical education program, and outdoor sneakers for outside gym. This will reduce the marring of the gym floor as well as a semi-annual maintenance of the gym floor. Students with the incorrect gym shoes will not be permitted to participate in the particular session for which they have the improper shoes.
